Christian County to Remain Open but with Offices Closing to the Public

OZARK, Missouri - In response to the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic the Christian County Commission announced today that Christian County offices will be closed to the public beginning Monday March 30, 2020. During this period, the various office holders and their respective staff will continue to perform their basic functions to the degree possible with public interaction limited to telephone and email. This action applies to the Historic Courthouse, Resource Management Building, Recycling Center and Road Barns.

In the meetings leading up to this decision, Danny Gray, the Christian County Assessor said “It’s important for people to understand that we are still open for business, but right now we just have to conduct that business through telephone, email and fax.”

This policy is intended to correspond to the County’s Stay at Home Order and will remain in effect for the duration of that Order unless the measure is withdrawn or removed by the County Commission.

Presiding Circuit Judge Laura Johnson made a similar announcement with regard to the judicial buildings saying the Circuit Court of Christian County is temporarily closed to the general public but will continue to process cases and to accept both paper and electronic filings.
